"People who live in isolated communities use passenger transport to access employment, education, training and healthcare" (*Transport Select Committee report, 2014*). However, the direct link between these service areas and the provision of bus services is frequently ignored.

A wealth of recent research proves the overwhelming case for the provision of rural bus services to meet the needs of older people, young people, the unemployed, those on low incomes, disabled people and businesses and to deliver economic growth. However, bus services are often threatened by a lack of cross service and cross sector thinking.
